provided, but many people bring their own brooms, hoes, buckets and edging tools. Tidy-ups are supported by many regulars, but new volunteers are always very welcome. The first Tidy-up of the year will be held on **Thursday 5th April**, starting from the Village Hall at 6.30pm.
