Playing field improvements

Playing field users will have noticed the improvements being made to the football pitch. With funding from Tesco's Bags of Help scheme the grass is being aerated, weeded, re-seeded and cut to provide a high quality surface for users. In addition, an area-defining fence will be erected around the children's play area in March, which should improve safety for young users, and three new benches will be installed.

Tidy-ups

Our popular group Tidy-ups will be held again this year, beginning in late April. Dates will be available on posters around the village, in newsletters and on the website. If you are not able to join a group Tidy-up please feel free to pick up any litter or debris that you find anywhere at any time, or go out with your own small group. Organised Tidy-ups are usually held once a week, so there are many days in between for litter to accumulate, especially around the A518, the shops and the playing field car park.
