The War Memorial

The war memorial was cleaned and re-pointed in the autumn, restoring it to something like its condition in 1920 when it was first erected. The inscriptions can now be read much more easily. The bed of soil which surrounded the memorial was removed on advice and replaced by matching stone chippings, to help improve drainage and to keep the lower sections clean.

Wildlife-friendly areas

The vegetation which was disturbed on the banks of Grassy Lane is regenerating, with nettles, celandine, dock, dandelions and cow parsley springing up. Birds are singing and nesting, and a squirrel has been spotted. The nettles in the copse at the east end of the playing field are also growing well. A polite reminder to dog-walkers – Grassy Lane is a public footpath and part of the village, so all evidence of dog-fouling should be removed and disposed of in the usual way.
