Highlights included children's posters, entry presenation pack, public awareness, churchyard, quality of small open spaces, village map, bus shelters, telephone box, seats and benches, surrounds of village hall, the 2 pubs, new play area and excellent private gardens.

generating pride in the village and enlisting the help of many residents of all ages and village groups to make Haughton a better place to live.
